- Selection

 - Things that stand out
 - Change

The Perception Process

- Organization
 - We organize our perceptions
- Constructivism
 - Theory of how we organize & interpret our experiences by applying cognitive schemata

- Scripts




Figure 3.2 Cognitive Schemata

Attributions

- The act of explaining why:
 - Something happens
 - A person acts a particular way

- We tend to construct attributions that serve our personal interests
- How we perceive ourselves determines how we react to situations

- Social roles

 - beliefs

Guidelines for Improving Skill in Perceiving

- Distinguish facts from inferences & judgments
